**FROM 10.00AM** - Street Songs from St Malachy's Primary School (sung at the original market opening ten years ago)

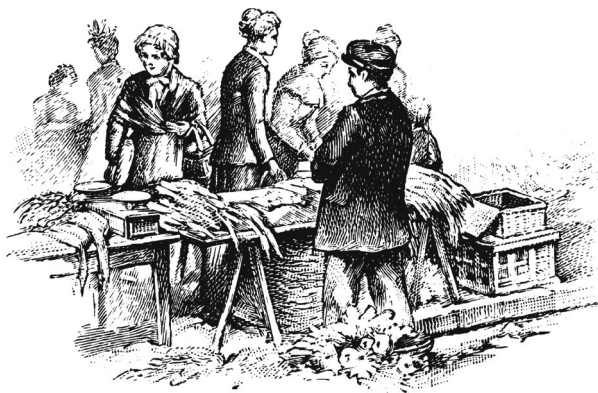
**10.30 TILL 12.00** – Belfast Guitar Trio
